**\* PRICING:**

**\$250** with a 25% damage deposit (\$65.50) *\* Rental Fee and damage deposit must be paid in full upon booking*

**DETAILS:**

- 90-minute rental for set up, ceremony, photos, and clean up.
- WBG will provide chairs, if requested, and will provide set up (must be requested upon booking).
- Signage will be provided to indicate "Private Wedding in Progress."
- Available to book on Saturdays during Phase 1 of opening (before and after regular visiting hours: 10:30AM-12PM and 3PM-4:30PM).
- Couples must complete a contract agreeing upon the terms and event rules addressing use of props such as candles, balloons, and treatment of the garden.
- Wedding Party will be allowed to park on the grounds with advance notice and will be provided a parking pass.
- Guest list will be limited to 10 guests in Phase 1 of opening, including but not limited to the marrying couple, officiant, and photographer.
- No refunds for cancellations.
- No outside vendors are allowed.
- **Note: Couples must take a tour and understand the on-going construction of WBG before signing an event contract.**

## COVID-19 Directions and Disclaimer

In order to maintain the health and well-being of our community, Waterfront Botanical Gardens is engaging a pro-active approach to the re-opening of our public gardens during the current COVID-19 pandemic. We are taking the following precautionary steps in order to maintain the safety and health of our visitors, staff, and vendors.

- All employees, visitors, vendors, guests of events, and volunteers of Waterfront Botanical Gardens will be required to wear face masks and maintain social distancing between themselves, each other, and guests of the gardens.
- All employees, visitors, vendors, guests of events, and volunteers will be required to wash their hands upon entry to the gardens.
- All employees, visitors, vendors, guests of events, and volunteers will submit to a touchless thermometer reading; personal temperature information will be recorded and logged at the beginning and end of each day. **When requested, visitors and renters may also be subject to temperature checks.**

Signage will be prominently displayed encouraging good hygiene including the use of hand sanitizers, hand washing, wearing personal protective clothing, maintaining social distancing, and visiting only when healthy. No-touch hand sanitizers will be available at the entrance/exit points, in our public building, and at areas throughout the gardens.

Waterfront Botanical Gardens reserves the right to ask individuals to leave if they or their family appear symptomatic.

During public hours, we will allow 10 cars into the parking lot at a time, maintaining two empty parking spaces between cars when parked. We will only allow visitors from 10 cars onto the grounds at a time. Signage will encourage visitors to limit their time in the gardens to 20 minutes, wear face masks, and maintain a social distance of 6 feet to 10 feet. Renters and event guests MUST obtain a parking pass in advance to ensure their space for parking.

Events at the gardens will be limited to outdoor gatherings of up to 10 guests within a 90-minute time frame. No larger events will be held until cleared by the Governor of Kentucky. Individuals of different households will be encouraged to keep a social distance. Event hosts and guests attend the event at their own personal risk. Waterfront Botanical Gardens suggests group photos be limited with minimal physical contact between separate households.

It is the responsibility of our visitors, patrons, renters, and all public persons to adhere to the guidelines stated here. Waterfront Botanical Gardens may not be held accountable for the non-adherence of these guidelines by any person or group.
